When dogs and cats are present, the ambient temperature in the indoor housing facility cannot fall below $50^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for dogs and cats not acclimated to lower temperatures, for breeds that cannot tolerate lower temperatures without stress or discomfort, and for sick, aged, young or inform dogs and cats except as approved by the attending veterinarian. Heat, insulation, clean and dry bedding or other methods of conserving body heat that are adequate to provide comfort shall be provided when the atmospheric temperature is below $50^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. The ambient temperature must not fall below $45^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or rise above $85^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for more than four consecutive hours when dogs or cats are present.
[Whelping facility temperature 91F.]
d. Indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall at all times be provided with ventilation by means of doors, windows, vents, air conditioning or direct flow of fresh air that is adequate to provide for the good health and comfort of the animals. Such ventilation shall be environmentally provided so as to maintain adequate temperature and minimize drafts, moisture condensation, odors or stagnant vapors of excreta. Auxiliary ventilation, such as fans, blowers or air conditioning, must be provided when the ambient temperature is above $85^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. Relative humidity must be maintained at a level that ensures the health and wellbeing of the animals housed in the housing facility. Indoor housing facilities must be capable of the following: (1) Maintaining humidity levels between 30 percent and 70 percent; and (2) Rapidly eliminating odors from within the building. [Temperature not regulated to whelping building.]
5. Ceilings, Walls, Floors

f. Ceilings, walls and floors shall be constructed so as to lend themselves to efficient cleaning and sanitizing. Such surfaces shall be kept in good repair and maintained so that they are substantially impervious to moisture. Floors and walls to a height of four feet shall have finished surfaces. No sharp or jagged edges may be present that may injure an animal. Animal contact surfaces must be free of excessive rust that prevents required cleaning and sanitizing or that affects the structural strength of the surface or that may be detrimental to the health of the animal.

I. Outdoor dog runs and exercise areas shall be of sound construction and kept in good repair so as to safely contain the animal(s) therein without injury. Floors shall be concrete, gravel or materials which can be regularly cleaned and kept free of waste accumulation. Grass runs and exercise areas are permissible provided that adequate ground cover is maintained, holes are kept filled and the ground cover is not allowed to become overgrown. Dog runs and exercise areas utilizing wire floors are permissible provided that the wire floors are not injurious to the animals and are adequately maintained. Wire flooring cannot cause injury to any animal contained in a dog run or exercise area that has wire flooring and must: (1) Have a solid resting surface of adequate size for an animal to lay on its side; (2) Be in good repair, free of excessive rust that prevents required cleaning and sanitizing or that affects the structural strength of the surface or that may be detrimental to the health of the animal; (3) Be free of jagged or sharp edges, and constructed so as to lend itself to efficient cleaning and sanitizing; and (4) Be of a gauge and construction to prevent bending and sagging and to prevent physical harm to an animal or entrapment of the feet of an animal housed within the primary enclosure. Exhaust fan not in operation at time of unannounced arrival whereas as morning temperature was 84 F . During inspection of whelping indoor temperature and humidity with exhaust fan working was $91 \mathrm{~F} \& 64 \%$.

Notes:
Whelping floors and walls to primary enclosures for mother's and pups not routinely cleaned or kept sanitary. Nearly all mother's found with matted coats and dirty fur.

Outdoor dog runs and exercise areas are not kept in good repair so as to safely contain the animal(s) therein without injury (one Golden Retriever was loose at time of inspection). Grass runs and exercise areas are substantially covered with weeds and holes are not kept filled. Owners report that weeds are occasionally mowed, that fence rows were once addressed with weed eaters, and that holes are filled upon occasion (but not routinely, daily, or weekly).

Corner of SW yard enclosure damaged and bent with farm machinery.

Each outdoor canine enclosure is equipped with self feeders and kept full. Fly control (strips, bags) is not present and is in no way controlled (heavy presence of flies indoor and out, dead and not).

Whelping building as over-abundance of flies both living and deceased. Deceased at window sills, floor corners, ceiling, both in facility and primary enclosures.

Available personnel is insufficient for approximately one hundred thirty-one canines.

Indoor temperature of whelping building reaches or exceeds 90 degrees (media provided).

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Numerous mothers, adolescents, pups in state of distress. Animals dirty and matted.
One pregnant female excessively lethagic

Whelping facilities found at time of unannounced re-inspection to be unclean and lacking routine maintenance of cleaning and disinfection to floors and walls (for all inhabitants).

Vast majority of canines are dirty and matted.

By owners admission approximately twenty-five (more or less) canines have been re-homed or exchanged. There is no record of such for review.
