Wooden door frames in boarding and daycare areas showing significant chewing/scratching damage. Wooden furniture in daycare areas starting to show significant chewing/scratching damage. Wooden half door in lobby showing significant chewing/scratching damage. Wooden surfaces must be kept in good repair and sealed so as to be impervious to moisture in order to be properly cleaned and disinfected. Damaged wooden surfaces must be painted, sealed, replaced, or covered to compliant by 08/16/22.

Notes:

Boarding kennel walls showing significant chewing/scratching damage. Kennels must be kept in good repair to prevent hazards to the dogs and so as to be impervious in order to be properly cleaned and disinfected. Damaged kennel walls must be repaired, painted, sealed, or covered to be compliant by 08/16/22.

Wire kennels and wire gates in between daycare areas starting to show minor rust. Recommend addressing before rust becomes excessive (citeable).

Notes:

Some plastic water bowls used in daycare are showing significant chewing damage, making them unable to be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected and a potential injury risk to dogs. Significantly damaged water or foid bowls should be discarded or replaced. To be compliant by 08/16/22.

Has signed an emergency vet care agreement with Dr. Bunn.

Notes

Five dogs at large in grooming room at time of inspection. Any commingling of dogs must be compliant with the dog daycare rules, including minimum square footage (50 sq ft per dog), direct supervision of play group (groomers cannot act as supervisors while grooming dogs), designated primary enclosures, rest time, written temperament assessments, etc. Grooming room is of insufficient size to allow facility to be compliant with daycare rules. Addressed at time of inspection. Will recheck for compliance on reinspection on 08/16/22.
